**Product description:**  $2 \times 10^9$  spores of *Trichoderma asperellum* per gram of product.

Spores formulated in a polymer, talc carrier.

**Dangerous ingredients:** None.

Puncture the triple rinsed container and dispose of via an approved collector or recycler. Do not bury, burn, or donate the container to any other parties that may use it as a container for food or beverages.
