2. Hazards Identification

Important hazards: May cause eye damage. May damage fertility or the unborn child.
May be harmful to aquatic life.

3. Composition / Information on Ingredients

Product description: A soluble liquid fertilizer to supply nitrogen, phosphorus, sulfur, manganese, zinc, boron and molybdenum to crops as listed.

4. First Aid Measures

Inhalation: Move victim to fresh air. If breathing is irregular or stopped, administer artificial respiration. Call a physician or poison control center immediately. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

Skin Contact: Wash off immediately with soap and plenty of water while removing all contaminated clothes and shoes. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse. If skin irritation persists, call a physician. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

Eye Contact: Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

Ingestion: Call a physician or poison control center immediately. Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water. Do not induce vomiting without medical advice. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

Symptoms: May cause redness and tearing of eyes.

5. Fire Fighting Measures

Suitable extinguishing media:

Dry chemical, CO₂, water spray or regular foam. Move containers from fire area if you can do it without risk. Dike fire-control water for later disposal. Water spray, fog, or regular foam.

Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Methods for containment: Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so.

Precautions for safe handling

Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Storage conditions: Keep the container tightly closed in a dry and well-ventilated place. Keep out of the reach of children. Keep away from food, drink, and animal feed. Keep cool between 40-80°F (4-27°C). Protect from sunlight.

Packaging materials: Do not reuse the container.

Triple rinse the empty container as follows: Invert the empty container over the spray or mixing tank and drain for at least 30 seconds after the flow has slowed down to dripping. Thereafter rinse the empty container three times in succession with one quarter of the container volume of fresh water and decant the rinsate into the spray or mixing tank. Puncture the triple-rinsed container and dispose of it via an approved collector or recycler. Do not bury, burn, or donate the container to any other parties that may use it as a container for food or beverages.
